Become an RN with your associate degree in Nursing from Goodwin University.

Flexible class scheduling

We've designed our associate degree in Nursing RN program with flexibility in mind. Most nursing classes are offered days and evenings, Monday through Friday. Clinicals include day, evening, and weekend options. Best of all, you can still work full-time or part-time while completing your degree. Once you complete the prerequisite courses, you will be able to complete the nursing courses for your associate degree in as few as 20 months part-time.*

Milestone education

Once you've passed the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX) and you're licensed as an RN, you may continue on to complete your bachelor's degree in Nursing at Goodwin University. The RN-to-BSN

curriculum can be completed part-time in 16 months, or uniquely designed to meet your needs. Our master's degrees in Nursing can prepare you for a leadership or managerial role in the field of nursing. Designed to accommodate the busy schedule of a licensed RN with a bachelor's degree in Nursing, our APRN programs can be completed online in as few as 27 months part-time. Apart from Orientation, Immersion Weekend I and II, and clinical practice, our APRN Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) and Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) programs are offered entirely online.

The ADN program was granted initial accreditation by the Accreditation Commission for Nursing in Education in November 2005. As of September 20, 2018, ACEN accreditation was renewed for 8 years. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for the fall of 2026.

The NCLEX first-time pass rate for the year May 1, 2023-April 30, 2024, was 89% according to the NCSBN. Program completion rate within 150% of the permissible time frame for the Nursing Program is 79.9% (September 2022-August 2023). Between July, 1 2023, and June 30, 2024, there were 187 graduates. 100% of the December 2022 graduates attained a score of 77% or greater on each of the end-of-program student learning outcomes.
