Flexible options designed for busy working professionals

Goodwin's FNP program can be completed in as few as seven semesters part-time. Apart from your on-campus clinicals and two immersion weekends, all your coursework is completed online. You can work full-time while earning your master's degree! Your real-world experience as a nurse will guide you as you explore patient care through a primary care lens.

You must be a current CT-licensed registered nurse (RN) with a bachelor's degree in Nursing to qualify for Goodwin University's APRN programs. Candidates with an associate degree in Nursing and a non-Nursing bachelor's degree can apply for MSN bridge courses.
