

Associate Degree in Medical Assisting

Medical assistants work closely with health care providers to ensure the timeliness and quality of a patient's visit. You will be one of the first faces a patient sees, handling responsibilities that range from obtaining vital signs to helping with examinations and handling patient records and history.

As a student, you will be simultaneously enrolled in the Medical Assisting certificate and associate degree programs. You will first complete the certificate requirements and receive a certificate in Medical Assisting; then you will then continue in the associate degree program. Some schools offer training in Medical Assisting — but not for college credit. Goodwin University is a fully accredited, well-respected, nonprofit university, where you earn college credits that count towards your associate or bachelor's degree.

Upon completion of the collegiate certificate program, immediately upon graduation, you are eligible to sit for the Certified Medical Assistant (CMA) exam offered by the American Association of Medical Assistants (AAMA). This nationally recognized certification is considered the gold standard of professionalism in medical assisting. Only graduates of accredited programs such as Goodwin's are eligible to sit for this examination. This certification will make you a more qualified medical assistant who stands out to employers.
